LOITERING OR CAUSING DISTURBANCE

Any person who is not a member of the school staff or student body and who litters on or about any school building or grounds without written permission or who causes disturbances may be guilty of disorderly conduct and may be prosecuted according to law. It is therefore required that all visitors register in the office of the principal and receive approval to be present on the campus.
