Program Description:

WSCUHSD Summer School program is designed for students who need remediation in core subjects to either improve GPA or earn credit(s). This program is not designed to be an opportunity for students to accelerate achievement of graduation requirements.

Students are encouraged to work with their school counselor to ensure appropriate course selection.

Registration:

Priority Registration: April 26 - June 4 at 3:00 pm – Registration during this time will ensure placement in class only if the minimum enrollment is met. For Priority Registration, return your Summer School application (completed and signed) to the Counseling Office at your high school (Analy, El Molino or Laguna).

Regular Registration: Friday, June 11, – 11:00 am - 2:00 pm, in the Band room at El Molino.

Late Registration: Monday, June 14, in the Band room at El Molino.

Students registering on the first day of Summer School will be enrolled only if space is available.

Class Time:

Block 1: 8:00 am – 10:30 am

Block 2: 10:45 a.m. – 1:15 p.m.

Class schedules:

Schedules will not be mailed.

Enrollment lists will be handed out at El Molino High School beginning at 7:45 am on the first day of Summer School.

Transportation:

No transportation will be provided.

Probationary Contract:

Attending Summer School to clear a Probationary Contract requires you meet all of the following.

- Enroll in classes offered on the host campus (Credit by Individualized Program is not allowed)
- Pass 10 credits
- Follow all school rules
- Have a signed contract on file in the Summer School Office

POLICIES & BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

ENROLLMENT

- Students not attending the first day of Summer School will forfeit their place in class and may re-enter on a space available basis.
- Students not enrolled should report to the office the first day.
- Students denied enrollment for any reason are not to remain on campus.

ATTENDANCE

- It is expected that students will be in attendance each day.
- If an absence is unavoidable, present a note signed by a parent or guardian to the office immediately upon return to school.
- Students enrolled in block classes are allowed to accrue three (3) absences. Students will be dropped from classes on the fourth (4th) absence.
- Students enrolled in Credit by Contract shall not miss more than 2 meetings.
- Any special attendance issues MUST be brought to the principal's attention during the first week of school.

TARDY POLICY

- School begins at 8:00 am – arrival after 8:05 is considered "TARDY."
- A TARDY REFERRAL will be issued upon accumulation of three (3) tardies.

GENERAL SCHOOL BEHAVIOR

The following issues may warrant removal on the first offense:

1. Disrespectful behavior to students or staff
2. Verbal attacks, harassment, degrading another person
3. Profanity, drug, party, alcohol or other inappropriate conversation
4. Violence, vandalism or possession of a weapon
5. Graffiti of any type in the classroom or on school grounds
6. Under the influence of, or in possession of drugs or alcohol, or drug paraphernalia
7. Exhibiting and/or prejudicial behavior by showing of "colors," inappropriate drawings or "signings"

RULES:

- ✓ Behavior problems will not be tolerated.
- ✓ School disciplinary policies will be enforced.
- ✓ Students may be dropped from class upon receiving a 2nd referral in that class.
- ✓ Students dropped from class will NOT receive partial semester credit for attending a portion of Summer School.

SMOKING/TOBACCO

State law prohibits possession of tobacco on the school campus. Smoking or chewing tobacco is not permitted within 1000 feet of any school building.

FOOD & BEVERAGES

Eating and drinking in classrooms is not permitted. Snack bar purchases must be consumed during the brunch period.

CLOSED CAMPUS

Students are not permitted to leave campus unless they have received prior approval from the administrator/designee after providing a parent/guardian note authorizing early dismissal.

PHONE USE

The telephone is available for EMERGENCY calls only during non-class time.

CELL PHONES

Cell phones must be turned off during class time. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in a student's cell phone being confiscated for the duration of the day. Repeated failure to adhere to this rule will result in further disciplinary action.

World History	11-12	The study of civilization throughout the world with specific emphasis on cultural development, geographical influences and current issues.
United States History	12	U.S. History with a focus on the 20 th Century. Students will study the history of our nation in preparation for understanding the world around them.
American Government	Non-Grad	The organization and functions of the federal government.
Economics	Non-Grad	A survey course in micro and macro economics.

Algebra A	10-12	The beginning course in the college prep math sequence. (Does not fulfill Algebra graduation requirement.)
Algebra B (College Prep)	10-12	The second course in the college prep math sequence. (Meets Algebra graduation requirement.)
